Opening Address, Emmanuel Kallonga, HakiKazi Catalyst

Honourable Guest of Honour, the District Commissioner for Bagamoyo, Facilitators and Discussants, Colleagues participating in this unique gathering, on behalf of HakiKazi Catalyst, and all the people who have made this dream come true, I welcome all of you to this colloquium.

In the next three days, we aim to enable individuals and organisations to share experiences and skills about popularising policies and the critical relationship policies have to action research, creative communication and advocacy.

Honourable guests and fellow participants, HakiKazi Catalyst, has been involved in popularising poverty related development policies in Tanzania, for over two years now. Our experience has been built in association with the following processes:

We have reached a point where HakiKazi wants to share these experiences with other individuals and organisations about:

- Skills for popularising policies
- o The impact of action research and advocacy on policy
- o Creative communication to generate policy awareness

This gathering involves people from civil society in both the mainland regions and Zanzibar, government institutions and the private sector.

The objectives of bringing everyone together are these:

1. To provide and opportunity for civil society organisations and policy makers to interact and exchange ideas, opinions and experiences on the subject of creating knowledge about policy issues in Tanzania.

- 2. To build a shared pool of contacts, skills and understanding that can allow stakeholders involved with providing knowledge about policy, to learn from different strategies, and empower ourselves collectively through this contact and information sharing. Building on this, we seek to make a contribution towards building social movements and knowledge networks which will ensure the right of all people to access and understand policy information, and be able to engage with it constructively.
- 3. Generate analytical tools related to policy that can enable all stakeholders to bring to the attention of policy makers, the implications of grassroots experiences, and the possible alternative futures they offer.
- 4. With technical back-up from Seafield Research and Development Services, a very concrete outcome of the colloquium will be the production of a user friendly guide that I hope everyone will feel a sense of ownership of, and which can be used to promote the popularisation of policy and its feedback to policy makers.
- 5. To create a bridge for interaction between like minded organisations generating knowledge about policies, working at micro level with those working at macro and global level.

6. This colloquium is not the end of a process. We are seeking to create more opportunities from this gathering, to formulate learning programmes, participatory research initiatives and continuous policy feedback.
